EMERGENCY RESPONSE

Warrenpoint Port recently undertook a major incident training exercise. This is an annual event on top of the regular drills and exercises the team undertake, to plan for various scenarios. This is good practice for the team in the unlikely event of a major emergency. This large-scale exercise also involves other organisations. Warrenpoint Port would like to thank the local NI Fire and Rescue Service for their support with these training exercises; as well as 'The Squirrels' specialist team from Urban Search and Rescue in Belfast. This major incident planning comprised of three scenarios:


1: A fire on board a boat in the dock with crew unaccounted for.

2: A scenario where an operational crane driver became unwell and required rescuing.


3: An incident of illness while working at height on a gantry walkway - this element gave the team the opportunity to test a new rescue cage that the Port had commissioned.

INTERVIEW

Roy Teggarty CLC Chairman

The Chairperson of Carlingford Lough Commission (CLC) Roy Teggarty has recently retired after 16 years at the helm.

On Board spoke to Roy just ahead of his retirement about his role and the time ahead.

What is Carlingford Lough Commission?

Carlingford Lough Commission is a organisation that is responsible for the navigational safety of Carlingford Lough including the maintenance of the buoys and the shipping channel.

How long have you been in the role?

It has been my pleasure and privilege to serve on the board of the Carlingford Lough Commissioners for this past 16 years, the last few as Chairman.

How did you end up involved in CLC?

I remember the late John Fisher asking if I would like to replace Sam Knox on the board because of my connections to the sea, being Kilkeel Lifeboat Manager, Chair of the Mourne Seafarers Memorial Committee and on the board of the Northern Ireland Fishery Authority. This was along with having family links to the sea going back generations and I was happy to accept the position.

What have been the 'ebbs' and 'flows' of your time with CLC?

Throughout my time there have been many changes and many challenges, not least from Covid 19, but also lots of successes. 'Navigating' Covid was definitely a core challenge but over the years we have had changes in personnel and changes in work patterns and agreements to work through. We have also had the challenge, which became a success, of recruiting new talent to the board. I am also particularly proud of the work we carried out with WHA on a new Port Marine Safety Management Plan during my time as Chair.

What's the Plan for the Future of CLC?

I believe we are now in a good position going forward although with some challenges especially in relation to financing. With the new Chairman Paddy Harty at the helm and Henry McLaughlin as his vice Chairman, the Commission will no doubt thrive.

"My thanks go to the Commissioners for their work over the years and our stakeholders for their support. I would like to especially thank WHA (Warrenpoint Harbour Authority) with whom I've worked over the years and their present CEO David Holmes, not only for his moral support but for the use of WHA facilities. I also wish Mary Taylor, Executive Assistant at WHA well in her retirement. And finally, I wish every success to the incoming administration at CLC who are in the safe hands of Paddy Harty and Henry McLaughlin."

BUSINESS UPDATE

SPS - Sanitary and Phytosanitary Facilities

Local residents may have noticed the removal of the former Aylesforte House by DEFRA (Department of Environment, Food and Rural Affairs) as part of its preparatory works for the permanent SPS Facility. Business

Despite the many challenges Warrenpoint Harbour has had a solid year to date. We continue to have steady import and export levels with close to 50- 50 split on these. This year to date we have processed more than 700 vessels through the Port. Over the summer we also welcomed four cruise ships, including the first public opportunity to sail on board the world's oldest seafaring paddle steamer, the Waverley. We hope to continue to support this tourism business as we move into 2024 and beyond.

Community Complaints

We have been very aware of reports of a localised intermittent odour at various times since late summer. We have commissioned an Independent Environment Investigation - currently ongoing - to fully review this. The results of that report will be publicly shared. We hosted our first residential neighbour visitor during November. Our door is open for any neighbours who wish to discuss this with us.

CHRISTMAS COMMUNITY FUND

'Tis the Season' for the Warrenpoint Harbour Christmas Community Fund

The fourth annual 'Warrenpoint Harbour Christmas Community Fund' is now open for community groups, organisations, and charities to apply for funding to support the health, wellbeing, and environment of the local area.

Over the past three years the Harbour Community Fund has put £60,762.00 back into the local community, supporting 78 different individual organisations with 123 different projects.

David Holmes, CEO Warrenpoint Harbour said, "Our communities have been impacted by Brexit; Covid; a Costof-Living crisis; the lack of an Executive which has impacted funding; and now more recently, localised flooding that has impacted homes and businesses within our hinterland.

"We absolutely understand the many challenges that groups and charities are facing as we head towards 2024. We remain very proud of our place in the local community and the value the Community Fund has added to the local charity, social and community sector.

"Last year examples included:

- £1,000 bought Christmas meat packs for 20 families living in fear who were being supported through Women's Aid Armagh Down;
- £800 bought a fill of oil for the Newry and Mourne Multiple Sclerosis Therapy Centre;
- £500 bought Cycle Lessons for children with Down Syndrome
- while £250 bought 10 Counselling sessions for people with suicidal thoughts in our local community.

"These are just some of the 61 projects we were able to support last year. We are working hard to ensure we can support as many causes as possible again this year.

"We could not continue to do this without the support of our customers, suppliers, and stakeholders, who regularly generously donate to the fund. We hope to have a final total available for the fund in the coming weeks and will be posting regular updates on our social channels." The Fund opened on Wednesday 29th November and will remain open until Friday 15th December 2023. To apply the recipient organisation must be based within a 15 miles radius of the Port and the project supported should promote the health, wellbeing, and environment of local people. The maximum request is £500 unless by exception, and subject to affordability; and the aim is to support as many people as possible. 
